We envisage a world free of ignorance, disease and conflict where each individual and group actively participate in the development of their own communities and enjoy equal rights and opportunities disregarding of their faith, gender or any other differences.

Imam Sadr Foundation is a non-governmental organization that seeks to bring about social justice, change and equity by working closely with the local communities in South Lebanon on health, education, and promoting a culture of dialogue and reconciliation.

Our goal is the healthy and educated communities that are empowered to plan, and participate in making positive and conscious decisions concerning their lives and surroundings.

The methodology of work is based on participation, capacity building, partnership and gender equity. Thus to achieve the following objectives:

- Improving life conditions for specific groups in South Lebanon. i.e. orphans girls, women, local communities in the rural areas) through enlarging their economic and social opportunities;
- Meeting the basic requirements and needs of the vulnerable, the victims of conflicts and those with special educational needs, aiming at enabling them of self-depending and merging within their environment;
- Generating the appropriate conditions to inculcate the culture of openness, convergence and consensus on building the just society rich with equal opportunities, accountability and participation.

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Programs and Activities - The Academic Education

The Kindergarten (1988)

Targets education boys and girls from different socio-economic levels. An interactive space where the quality of education and care are respected in order to build children's capacities and develop their abilities.

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Programs and Activities - Al-Afaq Development Institute

Empowers young people and women mentally, socially and economically.

The Nursing School (1962)

Prepares young to become professional nurses. The methodology is based on promoting the relation between school and society and activating the synergy among the various programs at Imam Sadr Foundation.



I joined the Afaq Development Institute – Nursing School 4 years ago. Despite the long distances I cross from a southern village called Kfarkila which is one hour or more away, I was attracted by the good reputation and I was looking forward to acquiring higher certificates from a school I simply loved.

I studied at the school for a period of three years and received many scholarships which helped me achieve my studies though I was threatened to be taken away from school due to the situation resulting from the war

that broke out during the month of July 2006. I am a member of a family composed of 7 persons; our yearly income is about 4 million Lebanese Liras. I got my diploma with distinction on the southern and Lebanese level (the Fourth in Lebanon). This diploma allowed me to get a job in Marjayun Governmental Hospital in order to pursue my studies and help my father with the home expenses.

On the personal level, I expect to pursue my studies at the institution to obtain highest diplomas and to continue with

the institution in all educational stages till I become a teacher in nursing field.

I hope that the institution continues with the current curriculum and to remain prosperous and to continuously develop and help a great number of girls as it helped me. I thank all who contributed in helping me and I advice all students to adhere to the institution without any hesitation.

Social Work Branch (2004)

A recent curriculum prepared by the staff at Imam Sadr Foundation, and approved by official competent authorities. Its purpose is to habilitate the trainees over participatory methods and to expand the circle of ownership of the local development projects. It grants two diplomas in Technical Baccaulaureate (BT) as well as Professional Brevet (BP)

Intensive Vocational Training (1998)

Works upon building practical skills for women in order to help them entering the work field and empowering them socially and economically. It consists of intensive professional sessions of a period of nine months, targeting women who wish to exercise one of the following professions:

- Women Hairdressing, in Tyr and Beirut
- Secretariat, in Tyr and Beirut
- Child assistance, in Tyr
- Gardening and flower arrangements, in Tyr
- Hotelery, in Tyr.

*He asked me:
- "How do you like the man to be?"*

I found myself with time at the Afaq Development Institute related to Imam Sadr Foundation where I had the capacity to readjust my points of strength and choices. Yesterday, when I was playing with my daughters laughing out loud, I found myself in front of one only decision of wisdom: I will graduate soon and I will claim their custody whatever it takes for we have many things to share for the first time.

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Orphanage Care Program

This program aims at girls who lost one of their parents and those who have similar issues such as being subjected to difficult social and economic situations. The program provides comprehensive services including accommodation, food, clothes, transportation, healthcare and education. It strives to provide services to the girl within her family.

The program helps in realizing psychological and social equilibrium for the girl by developing her talents and promoting her self esteem and building her cultural and social skills. It made significant progress towards expanding its impact through including the family members. Educational and social acquisitions of the girls are invested in promoting their family context and improving the life styles while enlarging the opportunities of integration and inclusiveness.

Story of Nawal El Hajj Khier, 33 years old

Life which consoles poor people and makes them live with love, freedom and peace, and those who have peace within themselves; there are the thorns that hinder this life and which shall odorously bloom one day with no doubt. This is Nawal El Hajj Kheir who came when she was four years old orphan from both sides.

Nawal was raised according to Imam Sadr curriculum. She learned the concepts he established. She grew up along with many colleagues within the gardens of charity. She pursued her studies successfully till she entered the professional Afaq Institute to learn the tailoring profession and she worked at the Foundation ateliers. Then a guy with the name of Tarek Shahine asked her for marriage... the Foundation continued to be there to proceed in equipping her house and organizing the wedding ceremony.

She gave birth to Mohamed and Mustapha. Years later, Nawal got back to the institution to take care of an orphan. It is a path of charity that is renewed and preserved (The only retribution for Charity is Charity) Al Rihman 6o



Programs and Activities - Social and Rural Development

Economic and Professional Empowerment of the Female Farmers

It targets women working in agriculture in seven southern villages surrounding Aita Al-Shaab, and adopts participative manners starting the tempering of work conditions in the traditional agriculture (i.e. tobacco) and introducing accompanying and similar agricultures that can represent reliable alternatives later on. Material outcomes of the project are a nursery for the purpose of training, planting seeds and trees, a car for transport in addition to necessary equipments and awareness materials, while most of the budget is allocated to build human abilities through training components and workshops.

The initiative aimed at contributing to improve the quality of life of the targeted category by empowering women. The specific objectives are:

- Suggestion of safe alternatives (agricultural and non agricultural) encouraging the population to reconsider their livelihood choices;
- Empowering women with

professional skills linked to working opportunities available locally;

- Help in finding marketing ways to sell the local agricultural products;
- Soothing the working conditions for the general workers in tobacco culture, mainly the children.

Women were able to overcome what they argue about and to gather around the subsistence concern while showing eagerness and determination to search for the best. This gathering constituted an additional stimulation for the foundation to move forward with parents in order to establish these promising tendencies and build upon it, i.e. preserving the same by creating successive opportunities for common and continuous work.



Mother and Child Community Health Improvement in South Lebanon

In order to raise the level of health knowledge and be able to follow safe health behaviors, Imam Sadr Foundation trained 82 health workers in a number of southern villages during 2008 with the support of the UNICEF and with the cooperation of the Ministry of Public Health and the Makassed Philanthropic Islamic Association. A detailed guideline was issued from the project including main definitions relevant to health and local community and role of health factor, as well as factors of family and community health, in addition to woman and child care methods. The guideline shed the light on some of the diseases and injuries resulting from accidents or wrong practices such as smoking, drugs or else.

The characteristic about the project is that the trainees permanently perform in rural areas and have volunteered to spread the health knowledge in their surroundings by sticking to their usual roles as teachers or nurses or mothers.

In parallel, and thanks to the support of the World Health Organization, Imam Sadr Foundation implemented two integrated projects. A survey was conducted in the villages of Aita Al-Shaab and Rmeish as a model project to assess the features of the reproductive health in the area, while teenager boys and girls attended a number of lectures and seminars that introduced them to the concepts and good practices related to reproductive health.



Programs and Activities - Health Programs

To provide quality health and social services for the rural residents, mainly those not covered by the health insurance. These interventions are in accordance to the holistic approach as defined by the World Health Organization and by virtue of national strategies of the Ministry of Public Health, and are conducted in close cooperation with local and international partners.

Objectives of the health programs for the future phase:

- Institutionalizing the quality and approval systems in all health centers,

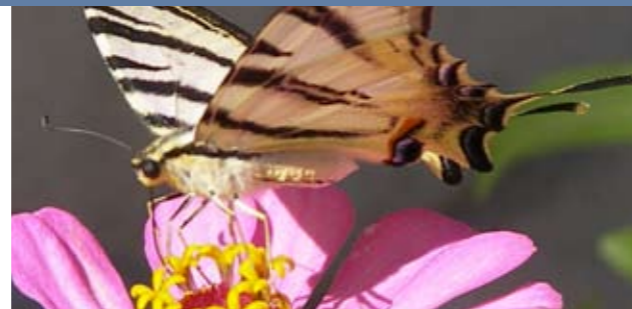
- Promoting the preventive health policy through community health programs,

- Activating the school health,

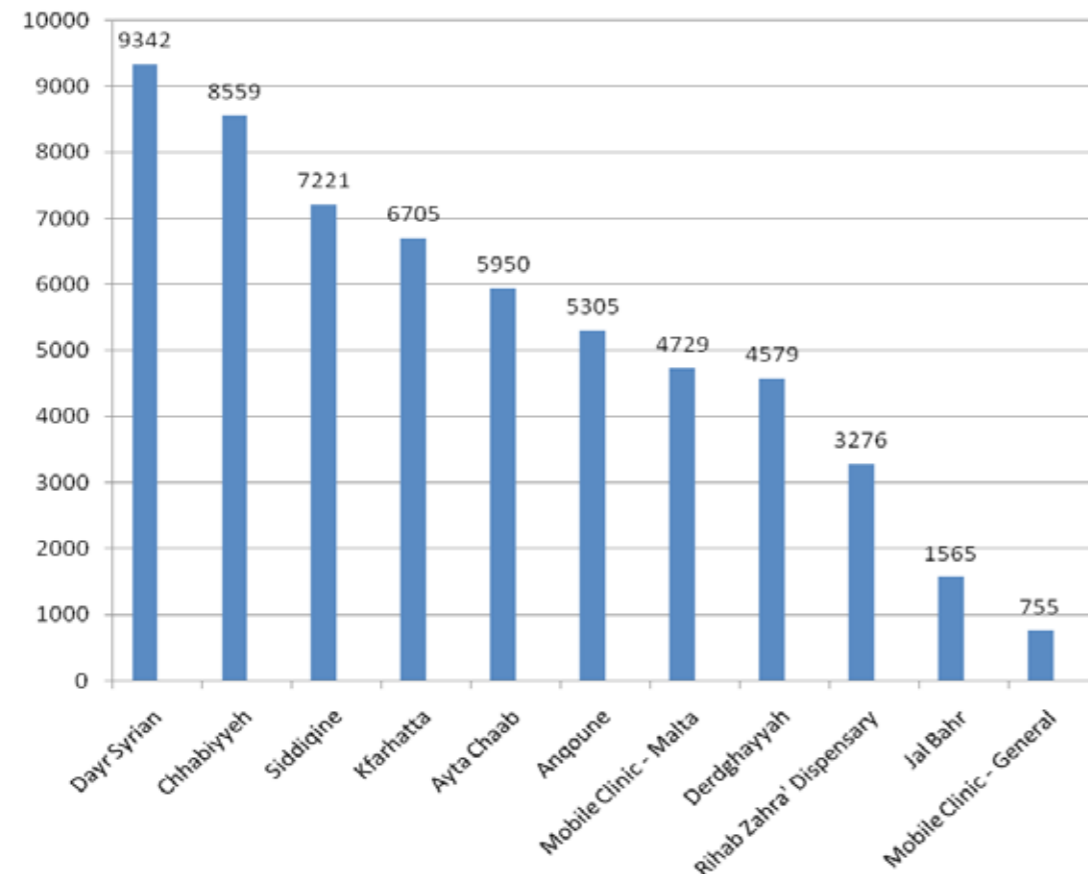
- Managing the health and social information of the patients through a computerized system in all health centers,

- Interlacing with state and private hospitals and other health.

Health and social centers affiliated to Imam Sadr Institutions are spread in the following villages: Sadikayn, Jal El Bahr, Al Shehabiya, Dardeghya, Ankoun, Kfarhata, Aita Al Shaab and Deir Sarian. The spreading area is broadening thanks to mobile clinics which roam isolated villages.

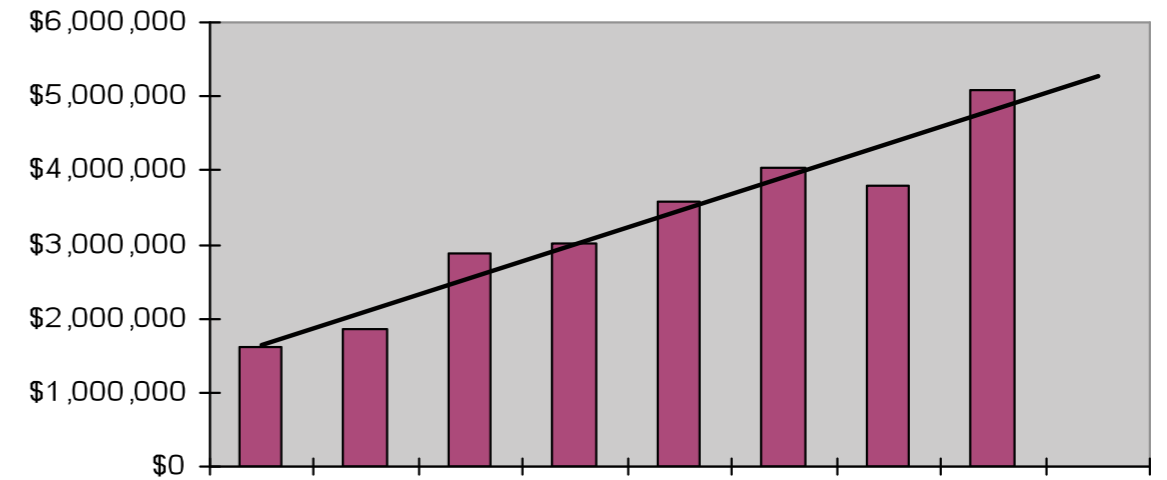

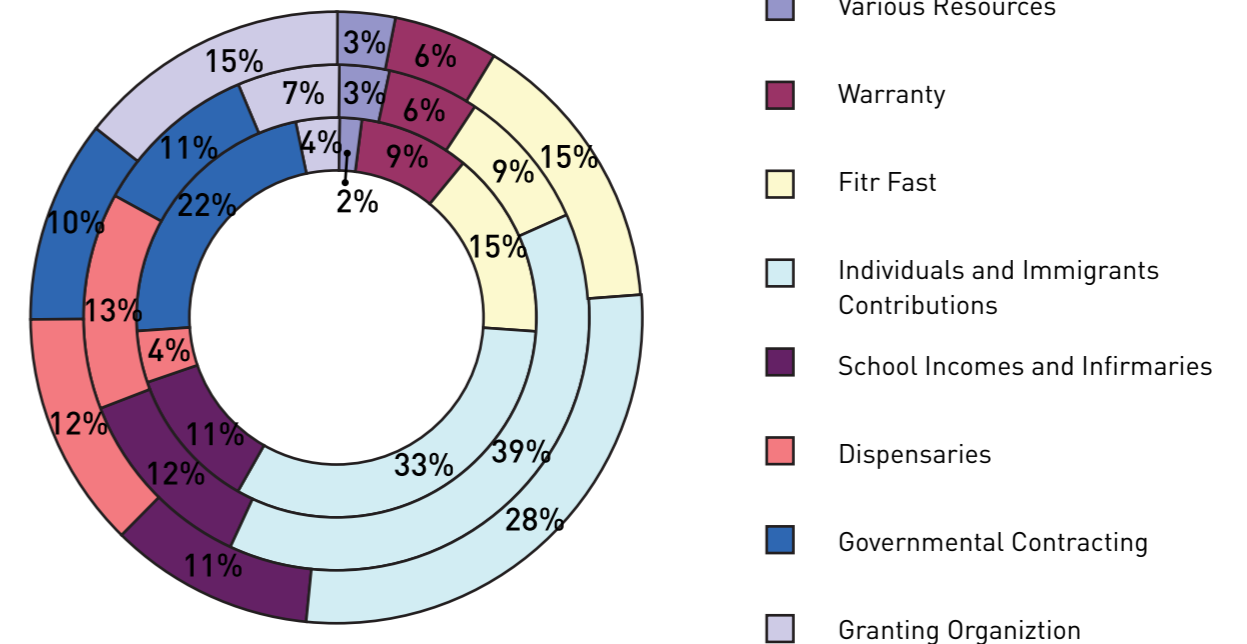

The associate weaved a network of strong relationships with Lebanese emigrants in Africa, Gulf and America, their contributions and the well-doers contributions from gulf people and others.



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Interaction Seminars

In order to recreate a Lebanese citizenship disregarding the main and regional beliefs by creating a vital area for a special type of gathering on the level of students, rescuers and teachers and others persons concerned with the work of associations, a common initiative between Imam Sadr Institutions, Social Care Institutions, Philanthropic Association and Makassed Philanthropic Islamic Association and it was able during the first year to organize many events that included hundreds of people. They gathered around Fitr feasts and participated in various technical and cultural activities in different Lebanese regions.

In parallel and for the purpose of communication, the association coordinates with "Monday Gathering" in Kisirwan, Aley Club and Cultural Movement in Jbeil. In addition to the negotiation and coordination sessions, hundreds of students were gathered within this framework in an environmental activity in the Shouf region. It also launched a series of lectures around the role of education in promoting the citizenship. The first was in... [???

Taking care to share studies with the others, the association's experience develops and interacts with the others' experiences knowing that the institutions utilities became a place for gathering for many workshops and coordination and communication seminars. It is present through its representatives and agents in most of the national seminars, as well as in regional and international conferences relevant with its work. Among these:

- Within the framework of the Seventh Christian Media Exhibition for the year 2008 "Mass Media and Dialogue of Sects" held in Mar Elias Convent - Intelias on December 3, 2008, a lecture under the name "Elections and Lebanon Tomorrow". The institutions participated through one of the members of its Board of Directors Mr. Raed Charaffedine who introduced an interjection under the title "Buidling the Civil Society in the Country of Religions".
- Under the invitation of the royal philanthropic institution in Bahrain and within the Second Conference for Orphans "a good

house is the one with an orphan" held early month of April 2008, during which the institutions were represented by Dr. Maha Abu Khalil who transferred her experience within her family.

- During the MEQA conference regarding the quality and distinction held in Dubai between April 7 and 9, 2008, Mr. Raed Charafeddine exposed the association's experience in the form of a research paper under the title "Quality is a road map towards sustainability, Quality effects over the non governmental organization"

- Ten days after, on Friday, March 14: Imam Sadr Institutions will be rewarded by the Cultural Movement in Intelias;

- Within few weeks, we shall send a coordinator for our programs to a special training in the ladder building institute affiliated to Mennonite University in Harrisonburg - Virginia;

A Briefing around the Beneficiaries

Each morning of a working day in Imam Sadr Institutions:

- There are 850 children (boys and girls) who get ready for a school day in one of the academic institutes affiliated to Imam Sadr Institutions;
- There are 330 young women or women preparing their handy bags for the training at our professional and technical institutes over skills designed according to the possibilities available in rural communities such as jobs and majors;
- There are around 200 persons getting ready to visit one of our health and social centers spread in the South for the purpose of a clinical inspection or a lab test or to ask for a drug pill that they were unable to afford;
- More than 350 persons are ready to spend the night to provide services for these persons. These people are the driver, the guard, the teacher, the nurse, the doctor and the administrative. They have a main feature is that they

are settle in the villages and the benefit of Imam Sadr Institutions is that they are fixed as well and provide them with reliable and promising work opportunities. Their stability contribute to the stability of thousands of families thanks to the health and social protection network which is carefully designed;

Our figures register a yearly development of 20% in the size of offerings and in number of beneficiaries. However, we believe that the added value resulting from the association activity has a quality aspect of no less importance than the digital aspect:

- The offerings of the rural offerings are promoted in two directions: The first is represented by health equipments which can transform the dispensary into a rural hospital; the second transforms the center into a rural and social developed core. For instance, in Aita Al Shaab, we find a doctor, a nurse, an agriculture engineer, a development expert,

a social worker and a statistical investigator... we find them working side by side with dozens of guys and girls of the neighboring villages such as Rmeish, Dibel, Ramya, Beit Leef, Kawzah in addition to Aita Al Shaab definitely. this activity includes many partners such as the governmental such as the Council of Development and Construction; international such as the World Health Organization; local such as municipalities. This is how the center is transformed into a gathering area and a dialogue field where people with different meet over the same concerns and they formulate common hopes for a better tomorrow for all.

- The following experience progresses and interacts with the others experiences. The association is careful and active in sharing studies with others. The association utilities became a gathering field for many workshops and coordination and communication seminars. It is present through its representatives and agents in most of the relevant seminars.

The Social and Educational Returns

Upon evaluating the social returns, it is noted that women are the direct category. However, the overall return require the analysis of the effect performed by women within their families on one hand, and on the other hand to measure what might the situation has been if the association has not interfered to make a significant step in the life of this person or that.

- Educational, psychological and social empowerment through the care provided to female orphans, as well as habilitating and accompanying them till they are ready to enter the work field.
- Their number exceeded ٥٠٠ girls since the establishment of the service with a residency rate exceeding ١ years knowing that some entered the institution at the age of four, graduated fro university and got a job in one of the association programs;
- Providing a model nursery merging the well-to-do with the underprivileged as well as providing a pioneered service according to the latest scientific and educational curriculums;
- Providing specialized educational services for those who require special educational needs among those who suffer for lack of focus, mentally behind or simple to middle retardation, etc;
- Health and social empowerment through the mother and child care programs, dialogue and awareness sessions and services provided by health and social centers spread in rural areas. They are characterized by their non stop work during the occupation period in extremely complicated conditions and on the demarcation lines. It is still paying extreme attention to reach the rural people in their homes where other health services are almost inexistent or hard to provide or expensive.

- Professional and technical empowerment at the nursing school (٨١٠ graduates since its foundation) and intensive vocational training programs (around ١١٢٠ graduates within ١٠ years), social activation branch which is the fist of his kind in Lebanon.

- Legal and political empowerment to perform a deep social change by reconsidering the justice of the roles inherent with each woman and man and via energy dialogues and fighting all types of discrimination

Provide an institutionalized model to be followed on the level of active attendance of women in the decision making procedures. This is reflected by the institutionalized structure of the association. This latter includes around 300 regular volunteers, 200 full-time employees and 250 part-time employees, knowing that the women percentage in the three categories exceeds 80%.
